

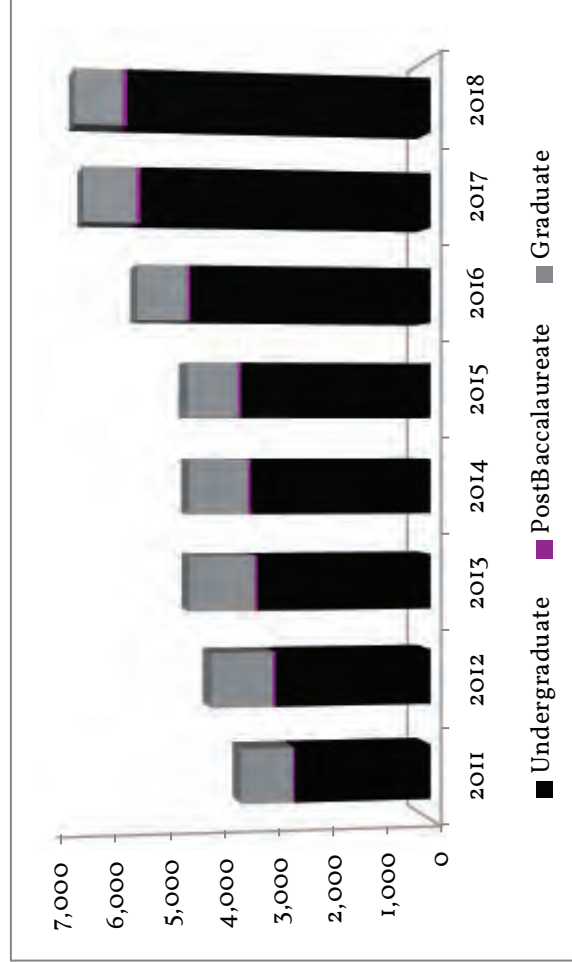

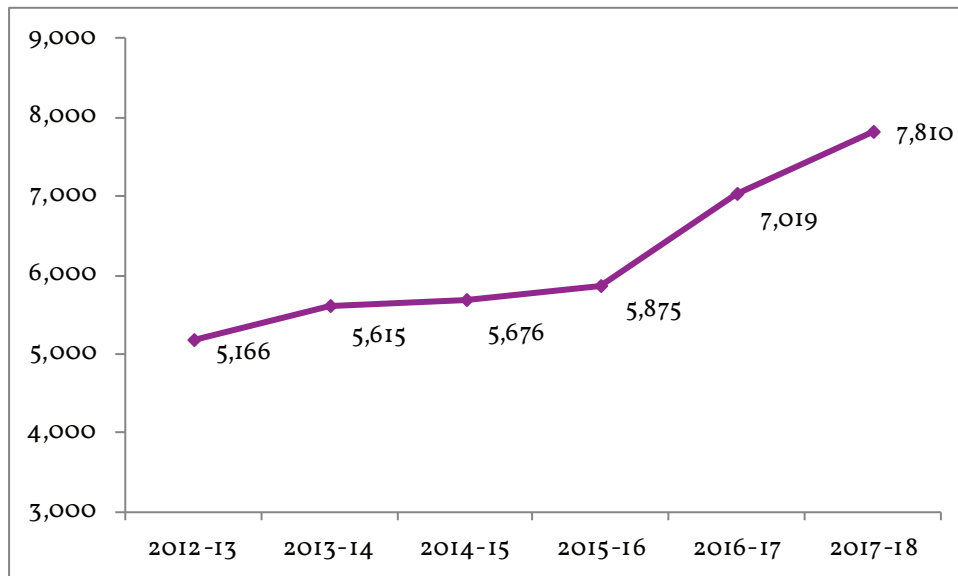

Annual Unduplicated Enrollment⁶

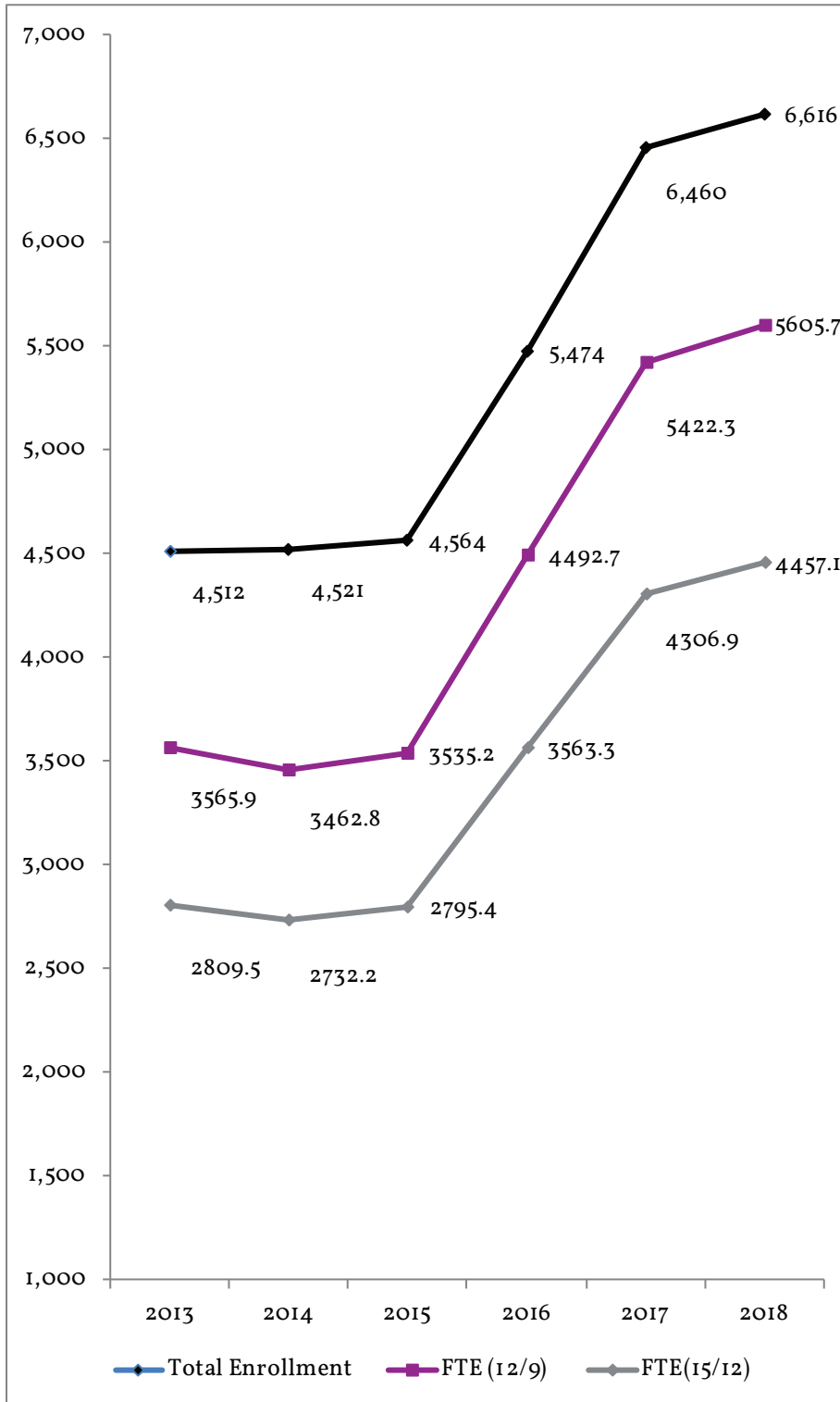

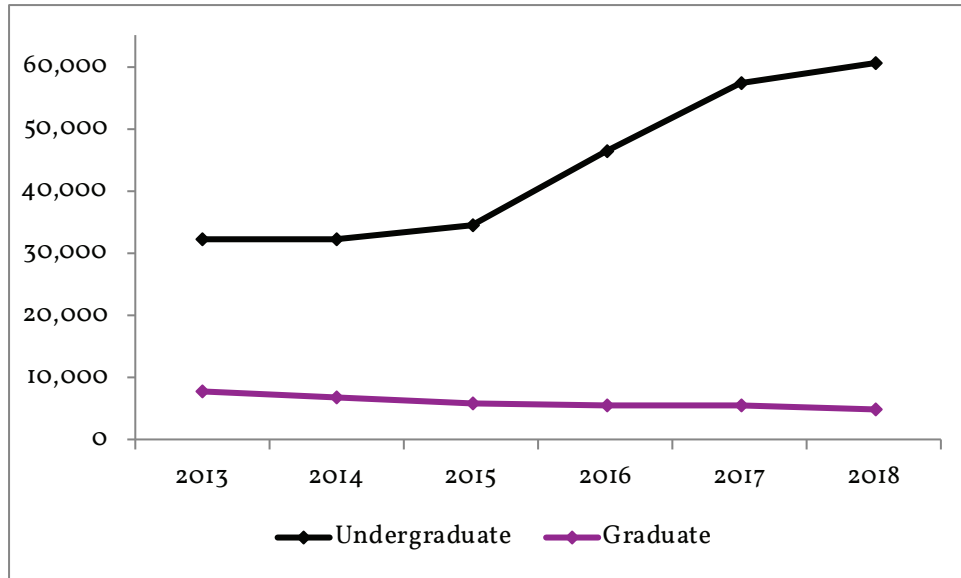

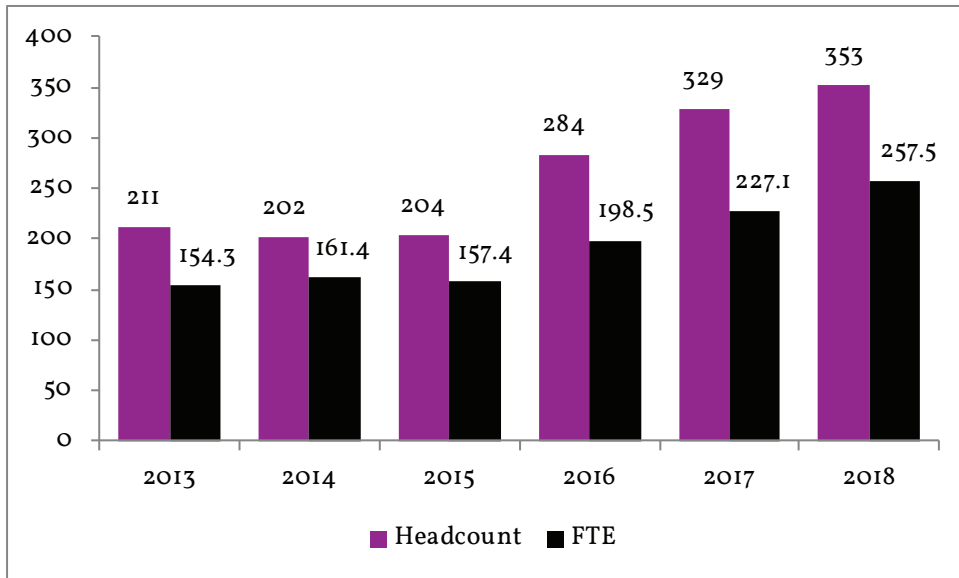

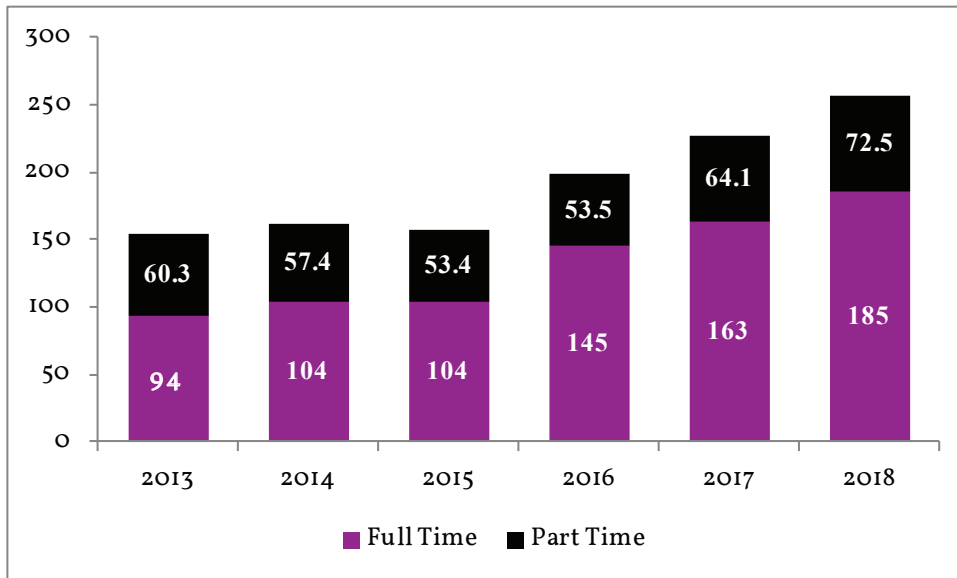

A&M-SA Faculty, Fall 2013 - 2018¹

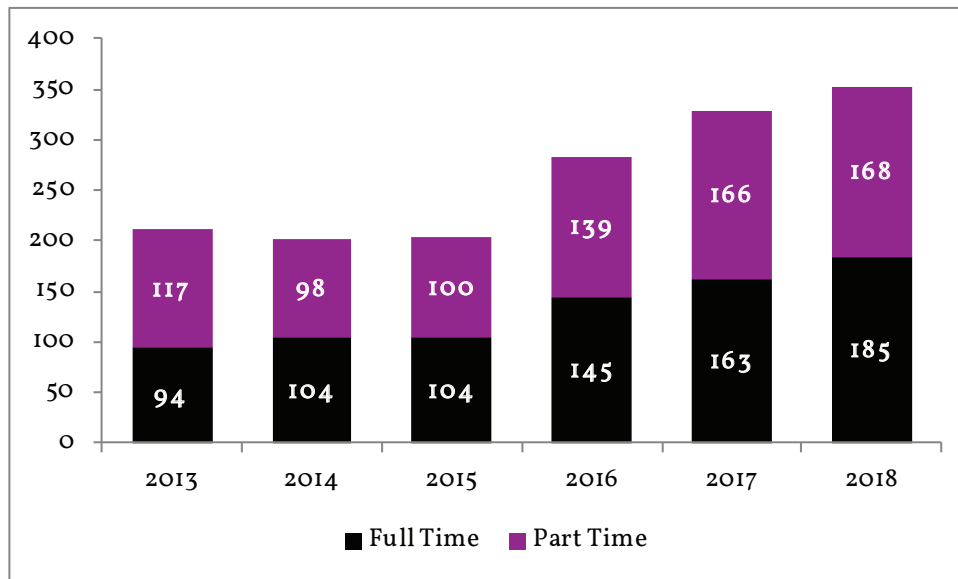


Faculty FTE (Full-Time Equivalent), Fall 2013 - 2018

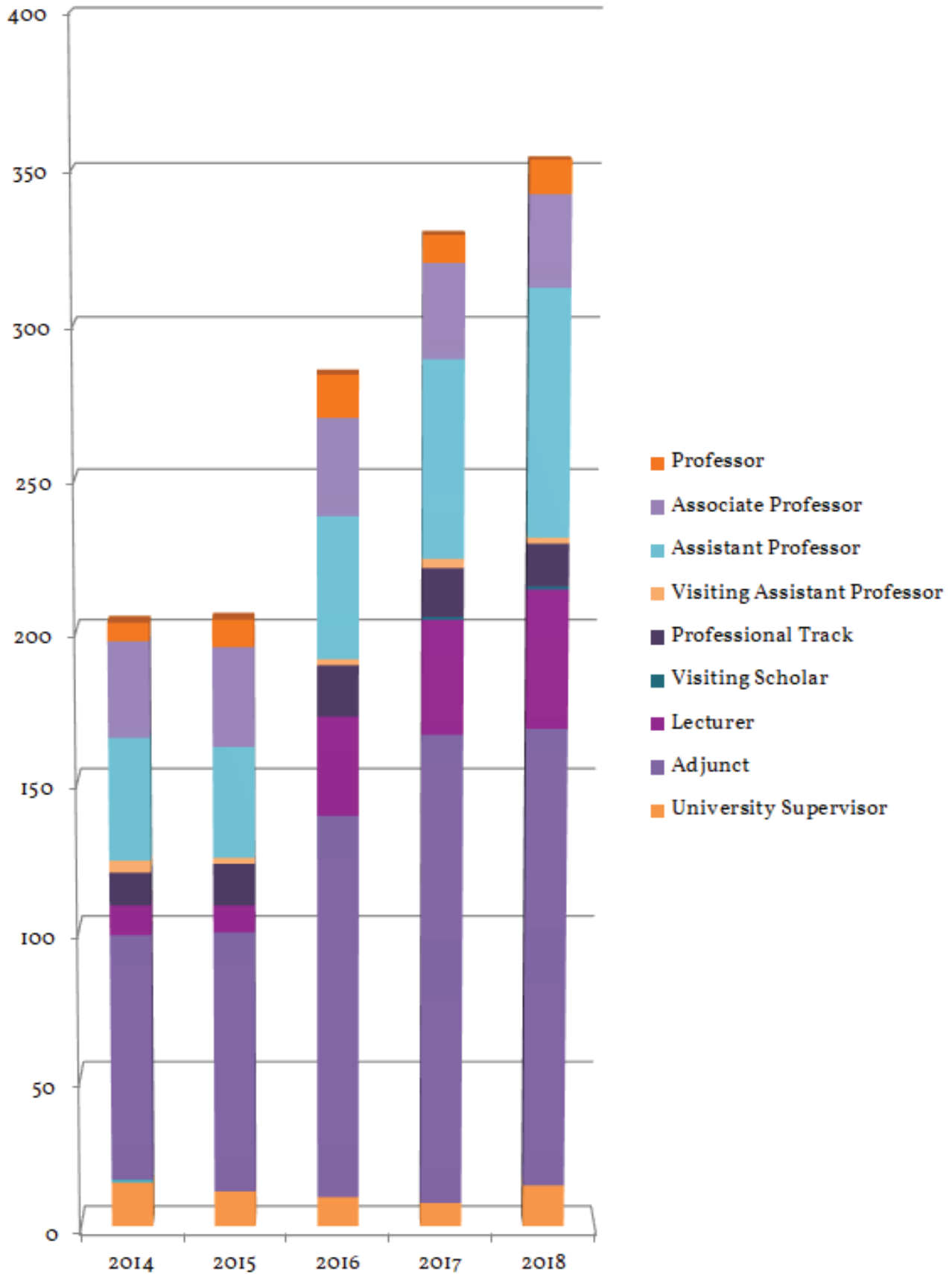
