#### **COMMITTEE OVERVIEW**

The SFAC met four times to determine the recommendations of this report. The first meeting was held January 27, 2022 to orient the student members on the Texas Education Codes. An overview of the institutional budget, the budget development process and the budgets for the Athletic Fee, Recreational Sports Fee and Student Service Fee were explained. The committee then determined their length of terms for members (one year or two year) and selected Kirstan Garcia as the chair of the committee. The SFAC met February 2, 2023 and February 11, 2022 to hear budget presentations from Athletics, Recreational Sports and various departments within the Division of Student Success and Engagement. On February 17, 2022 the SFAC met to make their final recommendations presented in this report.

# **FY 2023 STUDENT ATHLETIC FEE PROJECTION**

For FY23, the Office of Business Affairs projects \$1,323,520 in the Athletics Fee revenue, an estimated increase of \$0 from FY2022 budget.

# **ONE-TIME STUDENT SERVICE FEE FUNDING REQUEST**

For FY23 the committee did not approve any one-time request or leave any funds unappropriated from Student Service Fees.

# ATHLETICS, RECREATIONAL SPORTS AND STUDENT SERVICE FEE COMMENTS

The committee carefully considered each funding request for FY23. Athletics, Recreational Sports and all department currently funded within the Student Service Fee were invited to present. Departments were advised that no new funds would be available as forecasting for fees revenue was calculated on a zero percent growth rate. As part of funding request the committee asked each department to provide a description on how all funding would assist within the program, services and activities will involve students, support the university's strategic plan and impact retention and/or graduation.

### ATHLETIC FEE

Committee accepted all request as presented to continue current funding. Presentation included no changes in allocations from previous FY22 allocations.

### RECREATIONAL SPORTS FEE

Committee accepted all request as presented to continue current funding. Presentation included no changes in funding amount but included three changes in allocations from FY22. The change in allocations would allow the competitive hiring of a E-Sports coach position currently vacant.

Operations: Decrease of \$6,500
Salaries: Increase of \$5,000
Benefits: Increase of \$1,500

### STUDENT SERVICE FEE

After listening to all presentations and request for FY23 the request totaled \$2,339,857. The request exceeded the projected budget by \$440,791(as depicted in Appendix A). As a result the committee elected to only review changes to salary, longevity and benefit request for currently funded position and transferring of funding within existing monies to cover competitive pay, hiring and promotions of existing positions and fully funding positions currently partially funded by student fees. The Request presented but not considered can be seen on Appendix B. Approvals included:

- Student Involvement: Transferred of \$29,081 (\$22,082 in Salaries, \$151 in Longevity and \$6,849 in Benefits) from wages into salary, longevity and benefit to support the promotion of Assistant Director (O00826) and hiring of an Administrative Admin (P-72910)
- Student Counseling Center: Transferring of \$18,430 (\$14,104 Salaries, \$111 Longevity & \$4,215 Benefits) from Dean of Students into Student Counseling Center to promotion of Assistant Director (O00893) and to provide competitive pay for Professional Counselor (P-58470)
- Career Services: Increase of \$5,103 (\$3,866 Salary & \$1,237 Benefits) for promotion of Assistant Director of Career Services (P-73434) which was pulled for reserve during FY22

- Career Services: \$6,602 (\$5,198 Salary & \$1,404 Benefits) to move Career Advisor(O00033)
   from 88.94% SSF Funded to 100% SSF Funded
- Disability Support Services: Increase of \$42,383 (\$32,320 Salaries, \$367 Longevity & \$9,696 Benefits) to provide competitive pay for Case Manager (O00032), Case Manager (O00739), Disability Service Coordinator (O00575) and Assistive Technology & Accommodations Coordinators (P-82630, which was pulled from reserve for FY22.
- VA Certification: \$54,840 (\$42,000 Salary, \$240 Longevity & \$12,600 Benefits) correction from FY22 Budget which did not reflect new position approve by previous committee.

With the aforementioned approvals, and the addition of wages and benefits, travel and operations approved in FY22 (as depicted in final recommendation chart above), it was determined that the request for FY23 still exceed the project budget by \$115,625. A request to keep a Career Service, Career Advisor (P-110376), position scheduled to transition from University Service Fee (USF) to Student Service Fee within USF for FY23 was submitted and approved. This resulted in still having to reduce the proposed FY23 budget by \$57,205. After discussion by the committee the following changes were made to department operational funding:

- Vice Presidents of Student Success and Engagement- Decrease of \$28,424 in operations
- Student Involvement- Decrease of \$8,620 in operations
- Dean of Students-Decrease of \$2,000 in operations
- Campus Activity Board- Decrease of \$4,000 in operations
- SSE Communication-Decrease of \$6,661 in operations
- Family Engagement- Decrease of \$2,000 in operations
- Alcohol & Other Drug- Decrease of \$5,500 in operations

Final recommendations are the result of a majority vote and reflects the committee's commitment to keep the best interest of Texas A&M University- San Antonio students at the forefront.
